The main objective of the project is to serve specific individuals by strengthening infrastructures and communication and information networks , by providing equal opportunities for information, sports and entertainment to all citizens.

The benefits of this particular project are not only for people with disabilities, but also an overall plan regarding the environment, services and information is being created, which will be able to support people with disabilities, families with small children and the elders.



With the targeted interventions in areas of heavy tourist traffic in Greece and Cyprus, physical, cultural or social obstacles that exclude people with mobility problems from the tourist product, but also from the provided services, are reduced.

Specifically, the intervention areas are Pafos, Agia Napa, Limassol and Paralimni in Cyprus and respectively Myrina (Romeikos Gialos) and Thanos (Evgatis beach) in Lemnos.

By those interventions, the areas in both countries, as tourist and travel destinations, improve and upgrade their services and expand their markets, satisfying to a large extent people with mobility problems.
